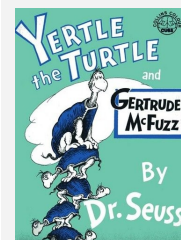

STEM in the ECE Classroom

As Early Childhood Educators we must be aware of the importance of fostering children's creativity, problem-solving and critical-thinking skills. STEM activities are a perfect way to help cultivate these important skills.

According to Susan Friedman in May 2016 NAEYC publication; "Although it might sound small, tinkering couldn't be more important. It is one of the ways children learn about the world. The STEM subjects (science, technology, engineering, math) offer many opportunities for children to use their minds and hands to play, explore, and learn. Research shows that giving children exposure to quality, hands-on STEM learning opportunities is so important and familiarity with STEM concepts early on is a key predictor of children's school success."
